#### **Argiva Bus**

At Arqiva we are committed to our sustainability objectives and we aim to become a net zero business for our direct and indirect emissions by 2031 and across our whole supply chain by 2040. As part of this commitment we are reviewing many areas of the business in order to assess how we can reduce our impact on the environment, for example we are working to migrate our corporate fleet to all electric vehicles.

Another area we have assessed is the Arqiva staff bus service which runs from Winchester station to Crawley Court 11 times per day, or 5082 journeys per year. These journeys use 6346 gallons of diesel and that equates to 75.6 tonnes of CO2 emissions which the equivalent of 38 return flights from Paris to New York.

As a result of a change in our working patterns, the bus is now underutilised compared to when it was launched in 2013 with 53% of all journeys running completely empty and an average of just 1.2 passengers when it is used. On this basis Arqiva are considering ceasing the bus service and replacing it with a car sharing scheme called Liftshare (Mobilityways – Zero Carbon Commuting) which better aligns with our sustainability goals.

Arqiva understands Crawley villagers use the bus service to supplement public bus services and we are engaging with the Parish Council members to understand how we can minimize the impact of the bus service stopping and support the village going forward.

#### **Local Plan**

None of the Crawley SHELAA sites have been identified for development. The closest development will be the John Moore Barracks where 900 houses are proposed.

## Workshops to identify corridors for future walking and cycling improvements

Hampshire County Council and Winchester City Council are working in partnership to start work on a developing a local cycling and walking infrastructure plan (LCWIP) covering the Winchester District. The purpose of the Winchester district LCWIP is to identify a number of routes within and between the settlements in the Winchester district - in partnership with local stakeholders - that they feel need to form the focus for future investment in improving walking and cycling – such as routes from market towns and rural areas into Winchester, Eastleigh, Fareham and Waterlooville as well as the most useful walking and cycling links that connect nearby villages.

To ensure that local communities play a part in identifying and shaping these priority routes, HCC will be holding two 'online' workshops in October. It wants to invite people who have local knowledge of routes that are currently used, as well as the barriers and issues that discourage people from walking and cycling more, in order to assist us with identifying a network of which corridors should see walking and cycling investment in improvements.

The two dates for the workshops are;

- Tuesday 4<sup>th</sup> October 10:00-13:30
- Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> October 17:30-21:00

The two workshops will both cover the same content and geography, so there is only the need for stakeholders to attend one of them.
