HEALTH AND SAFETY RISK ASSESSMENT

Crawley Parish Council has identified the following areas that require a Health and Safety Risk Inspection. This policy document is reviewed on an annual basis.

- Children's Playground
- Recreation Ground
- Sports Pavilion
- Pond and surroundings
- War Memorial
- Burial Ground
- Church Yard

DESCRIPTIONS

Children's Playground

The Children's Playground is sited inside the Recreation Ground just off Hacks Lane. Wooden fencing surrounds the play equipment; on the floor is grass and rubber matting.

Recreation Ground

The Recreation Ground is situated just off Hacks Lane and is an area of ground currently laid to grass surrounded by fencing and hedging. It is for the benefit of all Crawley residents and anyone who wishes to use it. The area is used mainly for Cricket and there is a cut Cricket square together with a large white painted Cricket screen. There is a Pavilion with electricity, water and drainage. The Recreation Ground is also used for Football and there are two football goals (not full sized). There is an area that has been tarmacked over that has a netball net together with 2 benches. As well as for sport the Recreation Ground is used for walking dogs and an area for children to play and ride their bikes. There is a car park that is accessed via a wooden five bar gate, this gate is not locked but is mainly kept shut. To prevent travellers or large vehicles getting into the car park a metal structure and an anti-ram bollard have been fitted that are locked. The car park is currently gravelled over.

Sports Pavilion

The Crawley Cricket Pavilion is located on Crawley Recreation Ground, Hacks Lane. It is a facility provided for use by Crawley Cricket Club, its members, and the members of visiting cricket teams. The pavilion provides a meeting room, kitchen, shower room, two changing rooms, a toilet and a storage shed. It has mains fed electricity, water, and drainage.

Pond and Surroundings

Crawley village pond is situated at the crossroads of Peach Tree lane/main street with Littleton road at the bottom of the village. It lies adjacent to road along approx. 50% of its circumference with the

remaining 50% being lined by trees and abutting the neighbouring private residences' boundaries. It is approx. 20m diameter and 1.5m at the deepest point. It provides habitat for resident and visiting wildfowl. A water trough and hand pump add aesthetic appeal and two wooden benches have been situated along the pond's grass verge.

War Memorial

Crawley War Memorial consists of a square plot measuring 18.46m on each side. On three sides, the plot is enclosed by a perimeter wall of approximately three feet in height, whilst the fourth side (the southern side) is boarded by a residential property. The area within is principally laid to lawn with beds on three sides and a paved path on the fourth – the northern side closest to the road. The memorial itself is centrally placed and is surrounded by a paved path.

On the northern side an eight- foot long teak bench is placed along the perimeter wall with a paved path running along this boundary. Within the beds laid to shrubs, are is an one oak and a variety of smaller trees.

Burial Ground

The Burial Ground is an area of consecrated ground (a small area at the top to the left-hand side is unconsecrated ground) with a gravel path running through it. There are graves on both sides of the path and throughout the Burial Ground and a large area of ground presently unused. There are some old established trees both in the Burial Ground and outside it. The area is fenced mostly with wire fencing and some hedging. A pair of iron gates lead into the ground that can be closed shut but not locked.

Church Yard

Crawley Churchyard is closed for burials. It comprises an approximately square area with St Mary's Church in one corner. A gravel path leads from a pedestrian gate by the road to the doors to the main Church building and the Church room. The churchyard is fully enclosed by a combination of wooden fencing and flint walls. The area of the churchyard away from the gravel path is filled with graves, all of which are more than 100 years old; the area between the graves is mown grass. There are a small number of established trees.

THE RISK CALCULATION

The risks which face the Parish Council have been identified and quantified in the Risk Table with the likelihood of each risk occurring identified as low, medium or high. The impact that the risk would have if it occurred is also identified. The most significant risks are those which score 6 or above, using the calculation "likelihood X impact" in which scores are based on the information in the table below:

	Check the boundary wall annually, by visual inspection. When any instability is identified, engage a suitable contractor as soon as practicable to rectify the problem. Overhanging tree branches:
	Check the trees within the churchyard at 6 monthly intervals for loose or rotten
	branches. When a problem is identified, engage a tree surgeon as soon as practicable.
	Uneven ground on the gravel path:
	Mow the churchyard regularly to prevent unevenness being hidden by foliage.
	Entrance Gate:
	Inspect the gate by visual inspection at 6 monthly intervals and repair as necessary.

The bank/grass verge will be maintained with regular cutting through summer
months and checked at 6 monthly intervals for evidence of tripping hazards.
Other Hazards:
Wooden benches are checked annually to ensure no deterioration in their
suitability for purpose and address any defects as they arise/are reported.
Inspect the road sign annually for signs of wear that may be a hazard.
Check the integrity of the horse trough annually to ensure no deterioration that
might present a danger
